- b) Consideration and possible action to adopt Resolution No. 15-1058, approving the proposed statements and estimates of expenses of the Town of Chino Valley Street Lighting Improvement Districts for fiscal year 2015/2016, pursuant to Section 48-616, Arizona Revised Statutes, as amended; setting a date for public hearing on the proposed statements and estimates as approved; and providing for notice of the hearing and publication of the proposed statements and estimates of the expenses of the district which shall be provided for by the levy and collection of ad valorem taxes on the assessed value of all the real and personal property in the districts. AGENDA ITEM TITLE:

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

Staff recommends that Council allow Mr. Nietzsche to reconsider alternative locations for the ~~memorial~~ MONUMENT.

SITUATION AND ANALYSIS:

Issue Statement The Lions ELKS and Klaus Nietzsche are requesting permission to locate the Granite Mountain Hot Shots ~~memorial~~ MONUMENT on Town property. Council previously directed staff to work with Mr. Nietzsche to find a location for the monument.

Summary of Issues and Staff Rationale Mr. Nietzsche would like to locate the statue at Town Hall; staff has suggested that Memorial Park would be a more appropriate location. At the direction of Council, staff asked Mr. Nietzsche to select alternative sites at either Memorial Park or another park owned by the Town. Mr. Nietzsche states that his preferred site is still at Town Hall.

Staff is seeking further direction from Council as to the next steps they wish to take with regards to the location of the monument.

Dear Mr. Smith:

The Chino Valley Elks Lodge #2842 intends to have a monument to honor the 19 fallen Hot Shot Firefighters erected.

We have a request for a place to put the Monument in front of the Town Hall pending before the Town Council for some time.

In our opinion there can be no better spot to provide the greatest number of citizens the opportunity to constantly be reminded of the sacrifice made by these brave men.

A place in front of the Town Hall will be 'altogether fitting and proper' to keep their memory alive for the ages.

It is my understanding that Mr. Marley and possibly others on the Council prefer the location to be in Memory Park.

It is our position that a spot in Memory Park has limited visibility, mostly to the local community. Our intent is to have the Monument placed where it can be seen by the largest possible number of people. This would work at a location fronting State Route 89.

Please cause the issue to be placed on the Council Agenda for May 12th for an up or down vote.
