

**MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING

7a) Presentation and review on sheet flooding from Ron Grittman.

Ron Grittman reported that in 2009 the Town received about \$200,000 from Yavapai County Flood Control District to develop a storm water master plan throughout the community. The Committee discussed the following items:

- Three (3) FEMA flood plains – Little Chino, Santa Cruz Wash, and Granite Creek.
- Town has several locations considered Zone X – low-lying areas where if there is a large storm event structures built low to the ground may get flooding.
- Two engineering firms were hired to identify Zone X areas - sheet flow areas, elevation mapping of town, hydrology, and hydrologic.
- Direction of natural water flow.
- \$390,000 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) money used to benefit low income areas Town will build up the Peavine Trail and dig a basin to capture the 100 years storm water, and build a box culvert to connect Center Street between Railroad and Cottonwood allowing for secondary access to the area.
- Ron displayed photos of past flooding.
- Provided information of 10 potential projects based on cost. Complete project reports are available at Public Works department.

- Estimated cost for all projects is 10-12 million dollars.
- Recharge credits from Salt River Project (SRP)
- Devices for water collection and extraction of pollutants from water.
