- 7a)** Update from Representative Karen Fann regarding legislation on rainwater harvesting and recharge.

Representative Karen Fann reported on study committee for rainwater harvesting approximately 32 organizations involved in this study group. Supervisor Springer has been involved with this concept for several years. Rainwater and snow pack have often ended up as flooding non-usable water. The goal of the committee is identifying areas of water resources not previously claimed through water rights and taking water from those non-porous areas to areas where it can be utilized and possibly recharged.

- 7b)** Update from Mayor Marley regarding use of injection wells for effluent recharge.

Mayor Marley reported on injection wells, taking water from retention ponds and gravity fed pumping water into injection wells. The silt that accumulates in the retention ponds could be recycled into other venues. If Arizona Department of Water Resources (ADWR) vetoes the concept of injection wells, the committee will focus on culverts as a method of moving storm water to natural streambeds where it can return to the aquifer at its natural rate.
