The Town Council Public Safety Subcommittee of the Town of Chino Valley, Arizona, convened for a public meeting in the Council Chambers Conference Room, located at 202 N. State Route 89, Chino Valley, Arizona.

**1) CALL TO ORDER**

Councilmember Best called the meeting to order at 4:28 p.m.

**2) ROLL CALL**

**3) APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

- a) Consideration and possible action to accept the February 14, 2017 meeting minutes.

MOVED by Councilmember Jack Miller, seconded by Vice-Mayor (Chair) Mike Best to accept the February 14, 2017 meeting minutes.

- a) Consideration and possible action regarding amendments to the Town Code Title VII Traffic Code, Chapter 72 Parking Rules: (1) deleting Sections 72.02 Blocking Traffic, 72.03 Parking Adjacent to Schools, 72.05 Parking Vehicles on Sidewalks, and 72.07 Restricted Parking Areas for the Handicapped; (2) amending Sections 72.01 Method of Parking, 72.04 Authority to Erect Signs, and 72.06 Abandoned Vehicles; and (3) adding new Sections 72.2 Presumption in Reference to Illegal Parking, 72.03 Parking, Standing, Stopping Prohibitions, 72.05 Removal of Vehicles in Violation of Parking Restrictions, all as set forth in "Chapter 72 Parking Rules Amendments, dated September 12, 2017".

Lt. Vince Schaan reported that the town currently had no provisions to enforce fire zone lanes around schools and businesses, for instance. Therefore, staff proposed to create a fire zone and add a provision for no parking on government property. Town Attorney Smiley had reviewed the City of Glendale's town code and suggested that Chino Valley follow the same, including that a vehicle could be towed when in violation.

Lt. Schaan also reported that in our current ordinance, every time a sign was put in, it needed prior Council approval, so staff recommended that any time a no parking sign, speeding sign or stop sign was needed, it should be approved by the Police Chief or Public Works.
