SUMMARY OF QUALIFICATIONS:

I have been an electrician/environmental technician for eleven years. In that time, I have acquired my certification on numerous lighted navigation aids (MALSR, PAPI, VASI, REIL, RAIL), HVAC systems (Universal), E/G systems, 4 types of UPS, have worked numerous projects at remote locations, troubleshot numerous system problems, and have taken care doing PM's at sites all over Northern Arizona. I have also become a NASTEP Evaluator.

EXPERIENCE:

May 2024 – November 2025 TSOG (FV-I) Albuquerque District

- Assisted Northern Arizona SSC in removing their RRCS equipment on both the incandescent PAPI and the LED PAPI at the Flagstaff, Arizona airport.
- Assisted Central Arizona SSC in installing numerous and various types of HVAC equipment at the Williams Gateway airport SSC building in Mesa, Arizona.
- Assisted Northern Arizona SSC in troubleshooting and repairing the INW DC Bus and Maverick ERMS at the Winslow, Arizona RCAG site.
- Assisted Northern Arizona in removing power circuit wiring no longer used in the Prescott ATCT.

July 2022 – May 2024 NASTEP Evaluator (FV-I) for the Central Service Area AJW-C24D

- National Airspace System Technical Evaluation Program Evaluator. Evaluate equipment in the CSA for FAA compliance with policy. Evaluate the compliance with policy within the SSC's by the ATSS's. I have been on over 12 evaluations. I have evaluated Lighted Navigational Aids, Engine Generators, PCS/ UPS, DC Bus, HVAC. I evaluate compliance with policy during Log Reviews and Periodic Online Log Reviews (POLR). I evaluate ETPR use along with other paperwork and online uses of information for equipment.

Oct 2014 – July 2022 ATSS (FV-H), Northern Arizona SSC

- HVAC at St. Johns VOR old and failing numerous times. Trying to remove and replace HVAC systems 14 miles outside of the town of St. Johns. TSC folks and SSC folks came together to replace the HVAC from two split units to two smaller Bard units. Now the HVAC at St. Johns is easier to work on and more efficient at keeping the VOR cool.
- The monitor pole at St. Johns was an old steel climbing pole. Trying to get all the different people together (cement company, heavy equipment rental company, etc.) from Show Low to St. Johns to get the old pole removed and the new, tilt down pole installed. Came together with the 802's,

TSC, and SSC personnel to remove and replace the pole. Now when maintenance is required on the TACAN monitor antenna there is a safer tilt down pole.

- HVAC system at the Tuba City RCAG was nothing more than two window units in a warm area. Another remote area without nearby support. SSC environmental techs along with 802's and TSC got together and removed the window units, expanded the wall area, ran all new wiring and conduits, and installed two new mini split units. The two new units will keep the radio equipment cool for a very long time.
- Flagstaff MALSRS has 63 in ground steady burning lights installed. The bolts that hold the lights to the runway cans are stainless steel and are known to break easily. With the support of TSC support, myself and another SSC environmental tech took one whole night to drill out all the broken screws in the runway to bring the MALSRS back to certified. Now the runway lights are easier to remove and replace.
- Flagstaff airport became the test bed for the New Bedford Panoramic LED PAPI. Being one of the first sites to have to go through the training, the prior sites were allowed to "grandfather" certification, I was the first in WSA to become certified on the new LED PAPI system. I assisted National and AJW with getting the TI changed for the main surge protector removal. The TI had a general surge protector removal involving removing power from the CCA in the main control box. The problem was the main surge protector didn't have power coming from the CCA, it came from the main power disconnect. I suggested the TI be changed to reflect that to change the main surge protector you must first "throw" the main power disconnect. Now the TI has been changed, and it is now safe to remove the main surge protector.
- St John's VOR E/G starting over 100 times per day. This problem went on for numerous years. Problem was intermittent and would stop for months at a time. Had TID out several times and had most experienced environmental technician in SSC both looked at it several times. E/G started so many times that we replaced 2 starters from being burned up. I and another experienced generator technician stayed at the site for 2 days straight trying to find problem. Finally had the E/G start and stop while we were there. Found a cold solder on a terminal board behind the RMM card slots in the equipment room. When the cooling fan in the equipment rack would come on it would vibrate and cause the cold solder to wiggle and send numerous start signals to the E/G. Soldered the wire back on the terminal board and have not had another 100-start day since.
- St. John's VOR E/G doing four-hour annual engine run. One hour into the E/G run the engine shutdown on ECM RED FAULT. Troubleshoot to the throttle body and the ECU. Removed and replaced throttle body but still had ECM RED FAULT after trying to start E/G. Replaced the ECU and E/G ran good for a four-hour run.
- Assisted Southern Arizona SSC, for two weeks, installing HVAC units at the Davis Monthan TRACON, the VOR at the Bisbee Douglas airport, and the RRCS.
- Replaced two R-22 Bard wall units at the Bagdad airport RRCS with two mini split units.
- Flagstaff MALSRS reported out several times in an eight-month timespan. During troubleshooting, I found that the 70 amp and 100-amp circuit breakers had popped. Found K4 solid state relay (SSR) had blown a hole out the side of the relay. Requested TSOG and second level engineering to consult on the amperage problem. Both TSOG and second level engineering assisted in more

troubleshooting. After several months we found that the 1A1 card software was old, being that the card had been installed new, and that the amperage couldn't dissipate enough before the next was being sent to the lights therefore the amperage was running too high for the circuit breakers. I removed and replaced the 1A1 card, with updated software, and the problem has not returned.

- Have been involved in several Joint Acceptance Inspections (JAI) for the LED PAPI at Flagstaff Airport, PAPI at Grand Canyon Airport, and HVAC at Winslow VOR.

Nov 2013- Oct 2014 Generator Technician Journeyman, W.W. Williams, North Las Vegas

- Inspected monthly, for PM's, over 30 E/G's for the water treatment plant for the city of Henderson.
- Rewired, repaired wiring, and ran new wire harnesses on the city of Henderson's police repeater site.
- Periodic Maintenance removing oil, oil filters, coolant, and overhauling E/G's for 40+ E/G's on the campus of UNLV. Job was completed in one 5-day week.
- Load bank tested multiple types of E/G's for casinos, the city of North Las Vegas, the city of Henderson, and private companies.
- Data Storage Company called Switch had 32- 12,470 VAC E/G's to protect the data of entities like Disney, Saudi billionaires, and other high-tech companies. Each generator had 3-5 UPS systems, switch gear, and all digital control panels. We maintained all the generator systems at this facility to include troubleshooting, removal and replacement of parts, PM's, and running miles of cabling for each generator.

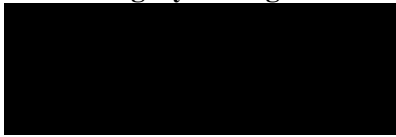
